Enquiry: You will engage critically with the social work knowledge base in order to develop deep and systematic understanding of current research-informed, theoretical and methodological approaches to practice. Drawing on this developing specialised knowledge, you will develop practical skills needed for critically-analytical, complex, diverse, unpredictable and ethical practice.

Contextual understanding: The MSc Social Work will allow you to develop a critical appreciation of the professional social work role, its ethical basis and its inter-connectedness with legal and policy frameworks and other professional disciplines. You will be provided with class and work-based learning that will enable you to understand, develop and adapt your skills, knowledge and values for varied practice contexts.

Collaboration: Class and work-based learning experiences will bring you into contact with fellow students, service users and carers, social workers, other professionals, researchers and academics who will support the development of your ability to undertake and manage the complex problem-solving required for social work practice. You will gain the opportunity to work collaboratively and creatively with others in groups and teams.
