Course Title

- 4. Provide a high-quality learning environment for learners in theory and practice settings where you learn, with and through peers, lecturers, birthing people and their families, and practitioners within a multi-cultural and multi-professional learning community.

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Teaching, learning and assessment strategies

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The learning, teaching and assessment strategy has the aim of transforming learners into independent thinkers who take responsibility for their learning in a way that is reasonable for them and does not compromise public safety. 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The assessment strategy for this course is closely aligned to the teaching and learning strategy, which centres around safe midwifery practice. The choice of assessments is determined by their relevance to midwifery care. You will be assessed across a range of practice settings and learning environments throughout the course.

To enhance your understanding and experiences of assessment practices, you will encounter a wide range of formative and summative assessment methods including those that enable you to undertake practice-focussed tasks that have the potential to influence care delivery. Many of the assessment tasks are designed so that you can tailor them to your professional interests,

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Approved Variations and Additions to Standard Admission

Be registered with the NMC on the first level Adult Nurse part of the professional register*.

Proficiency in English Language, and capability in numeracy, literacy and digital and technological literacy (NMC 2019 Standards for pre-registration midwifery programmes page 8).

IELTS score of 6.5 overall, with a minimum score of 6 in any area, where English is a second language (unless already registered with the NMC as a nurse or nursing associate).

Admissions Criteria

*The NMC requires those enrolled on pre-registration midwifery programmes are appropriately compliant with Article 40(2) of Directive 2005/36/EC regarding general education length and/or nursing qualification. This requires that an applicant to this course must be in possession of evidence of formal qualifications as a nurse responsible for general care (as evidenced by your statement of registration as a registered General Nurse in Part 1 or Part 12 of the NMC register). Other specific entry requirements:

Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) clearance check prior to registration

Occupational health screening to assess your fitness to join the course

Applicants to the postgraduate programme are required to provide their PIN and evidence of registration on the NMC register at the application stage. These are reviewed against the NMC register to ensure registration is live and there are no concerns relating to your registration.

There are no units that include both theory and practice assessments. In the unit Proficiency in midwifery care there are two practice assessments that cannot be aggregated. Students must pass both assessments.

Students may be given an opportunity to resit your failed assessment before the next designated resit point in units with

The substitution of units is not permitted. All units on the course are core and are mapped to the NMC proficiencies, and have been approved by the NMC.

Assessment Regulations

The course is offered over 2 academic years with students having to complete and pass all units of study. Students will commence their dissertation unit in conjunction with other second year units.

No aegrotat award can be made which would grant the protected title.

The registered midwife responsible for directing the course or their designated registered midwife substitute must be able to provide supporting declarations of health and character for students who have completed a pre-registration midwifery programme to support the student's request for registration. Any student who gains 180 course credits but fails to meet professional requirements regarding the declaration of Good Health, Good Character, will not be eligible to apply for registration as a midwife with the Nursing and Midwifery Council but will be eligible for University degree credits that recognises their academic achievement and which does not include the title of midwife (NMC 2019 Part 3: Standards for pre-registration midwifery programmes
