A learner exiting the course without completing it will receive an award that reflects the academic credit achieved to the point of the learner's exit. Such an award will not contain reference to occupational therapy and will not permit eligibility for professional registration with the HCPC and RCOT.</p>

Approved Variations and Additions to Standard Assessment Regulations

Students who fail a practice-based unit on substantiated grounds of fitness to practise concerns must be denied a referral opportunity in the failed assessments.

If students fail the first attempt at consecutive practice-based units, they cannot progress to the next level of study.

Students who fail the first and resit attempts of placement-based assessments, they have failed the requirements of the course and must be withdrawn.

An aegrotat award must be recorded on the certification, where this is awarded.

Each element of assessment must be passed with a 40% minimum mark. There will be no aggregation of assessments.

Aggregation of marks for elements of assessments that are practice-based is not permitted.

Compensation of units is not permitted

Each practice unit has a minimum 80% attendance requirement before any unit assessment can be undertaken.

Students may be given an opportunity to resit your failed assessment before the next designated resit point in units with placement assessments - OTH002-1: Holistic Therapy in Practice, OTH001-2: Enabling in Therapy Practice, OTH004-2: Collaboration in Therapy Practice, OTH003-3: Quality in Therapy Practice

Protected title: If you fail to successfully complete the course but gain an exit award for academic credits you will not be eligible to apply for HCPC registration.

No posthumous award can be made which would grant the protected title of occupational therapist.
